Horizon Impact Award (European Commission)

The uptake of R&I results created under the Framework Programme is important for the programme's success and is instrumental in contributing towards transformative impacts on the economy, society and policymaking. To illustrate the wider socioeconomic benefits of the EU investment in R&I and to encourage project beneficiaries to best manage and utilise their research results, the Commission awards on an annual basis a recognition prize for rewarding beneficiaries that have successfully demonstrated effective exploitation and uptake of their projects' R&I results.

Research and cohesion camps clash in Parliament debate ahead of budget summit (<u>Science Business</u>)

MEPs want a bigger EU budget for 2021-2027 but can't agree whether the extra cash should go to research or to protecting traditional programmes such as the common agriculture policy and cohesion. In a plenary session in Strasbourg on Wednesday, MEPs debated the next multiannual budget of the EU, which is to be agreed on by member states next Thursday. They worry about the hole in the EU budget after 2021 when the UK is not longer contributing, and urge member states to commit to putting 1.3 per cent of their gross national income (GNI) into the EU coffers, a figure significantly higher than European Commission's proposed 1.1 per cent.

Budget 2021 – 2027: mixed funding is needed to promote innovation (Science | Business)

Representatives of the EU's regions want to see more integration between the many and disparate EU programmes that are intended to support the growth of innovation clusters and promote regional development, in the 2021 – 27 budget. At a recent meeting organised by the Science Business Network,, there were calls for funding streams, including Horizon Europe, Digital Europe, Structural Funds and the Single Market Programme, to be more systematically applied to create interregional clusters and value chains, with simpler rules and less red tape.

EU Commisioner Mariya Gabriel: The future of Europe is everyone's future (*TheMayor.EU*)

Mrs. Gabriel, first of all, congratulations on your new appointment and best of luck at your new job. Your portfolio as Commissioner for Innovation, Research, Culture, Education and Youth has undergone several changes and has increased significantly since initially proposed. What are your expectations for your new position and how do you plan to combine so many different sectors?

Health minister: This time Belgium could mine healthcare data instead of coal (*EurActiv*)

Belgium has an enormous wealth of digital data, which could help it become a new "mining" country. "We could mine data instead of coal", Belgian Health Minister told EURACTIV.com in an interview.

Researchers stimulate areas vital to consciousness in monkeys' brains -- and it wakes them up (<u>ScienceDaily</u>)

One of the central questions in neuroscience is clarifying where in the brain consciousness, which is the ability to experience internal and external sensations, arises. Researchers report that a specific area in the brain, the central lateral thalamus, appears to play a key role. In monkeys under anesthesia, stimulating this area was enough to wake the animals and elicit normal waking behaviors.

Association of a Reproducible Epigenetic Risk Profile for Schizophrenia With Brain Methylation and Function (*JAMA Psychiatry*)

Schizophrenia is a severe brain disorder thought to be caused by a complex interplay of genetic predisposition and environmental exposure. In the context of gene-environment interplay and developmental programming, epigenetic mechanisms, such as DNA methylation, have received substantial attention in schizophrenia and other neuropsychiatric disorders. As epigenetic mechanisms may account for heritability not captured by other current methods, such as polygenic risk scores (PRSs), potential interactions between genetic susceptibility and epigenetic changes are of particular interest.

Keep the EU and UK collaboration in Science #DEALFORSCIENCE - ongoing (*Wellcome Trust*)

Researchers need certainty on scientific collaboration between the UK and EU. Science has been a key success of the EU and must remain a priority to keep Europe competitive. International collaboration makes science stronger and we should not let Brexit disrupt this. Researchers need a long-term solution to allow them to continue working together on the big challenges our societies face, transforming peoples' lives for the better. It's essential that politicians quickly find a way to keep this collaboration as easy as possible.
