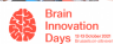
Last chance to register for the Brain Innovation Days!

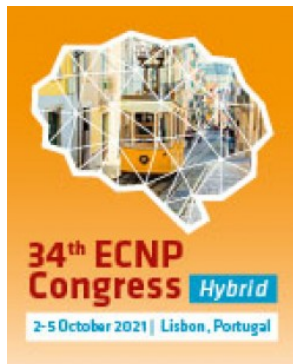
COVID-19 survey, Quality of life & Mind@Work project

This survey, developed in collaboration with the European Psychiatric Association, aims to explore the impact of the pandemic on mental health care and services, from the patient and clinician's perspective. Stay tuned for its release!

How can patients achieve good quality of life beyond a mental health condition? This has been the subject of GAMIAN-Europe's work in this area. For World Mental Health Day, GAMIAN-Europe is releasing: '[Top tips for better quality of life](#)'. This booklet is based on discussions with patients, and includes tips on how to improve self-esteem, communication with carers, finding a place in society, and more....Coming out soon!

GAMIAN-Europe has recently partnered with [Mind@Work](#), a project aiming to raise awareness of mental health in the workplace. This non-profit initiative is currently collecting stories from young adults (18-35) in Europe about their experiences in the workplace. The stories collected will be shared on social media to create wider discussion and developed into a co-created audiodocumentary podcast series. They will also contribute to societal research, including qualitative research on experiences and mental health at work of young adults.
