European Citizens' PsycheliCare Initiative Event in the European Parliament

On February 6, the launch event of the European Citizens' PsychedeliCare Initiative took place at the European Parliament. Co-hosted by MEP Tilly Metz (Greens, Luxembourg) and MEP Tomislav Sokol (EPP, Croatia), this event — moderated by EBC Executive Director Frйdйric Destrebecq — also represented the re-launch of PAREA's MEP Action Group on Psychedelics in Healthcare.

The morning programme included a thorough presentation on psychedelics from a PhD student, evidence-based research on the ongoing clinical studies in the field, as well as an inspiring patient testimony.

"The evidence shows that this can be a game-changer," stated MEP Metz. MEP Sokol noted that while he attends many events in Parliament, this was one of the busiest he has seen in a while — showcasing the growing importance and interest in this topic. We cannot discuss mental health without talking about research and innovation in brain health.

On 14 February, EBC Vice-President, Prof. Claudio Bassetti, joined the Brain Health Summit in Warsaw organised by Termedia, in partnership with the European Academy of Neurology, the Polish Neurological Society (Polskie Towarzystwo Neurologiczne) and the Polish Society of Pediatric Neurology.

In the session "Brain Health Strategy - In Poland and Around the World," Prof. Bassetti engaged with leaders from across healthcare, policy, research, and patient organisations to discuss national and European approaches to improving brain health.

With brain disorders representing the leading cause of disability and the second leading cause of death globally, the summit highlighted the urgent need to advance prevention, early intervention, and integrated care models - both in Poland and throughout Europe.

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The Lancet Neurology: Call for the Creation of a European Parliament Intergroup on Brain Health

The European Brain Council (EBC) addressed the SANT (Public Health) Subcommittee of the European Parliament on Oct 17, 2024, in Brussels, Belgium. Professor Claudio Bassetti, Vice-President of the EBC, addressed the audience on the burden of brain disorders, the increasing momentum around prioritising brain health and brain capital in Europe, and the need for prioritising brain research in European policy agendas.

Professor Bassetti also called for Members of the European Parliament (MEPs) to support the creation of a dedicated European Parliament Intergroup on brain health and research, which could play a crucial role in shaping EU policy and legislation. Most MEPs in attendance expressed strong support for prioritising brain health and discussed issues such as the need for increased research funding, addressing health-care workforce shortages, and building a stronger network connecting specialists in neurological disorders across Europe.

European Policy Center: How the Brain Economy Can Unlock New Approaches to Al

The last two months have seen intense global activity in the AI field, including the launch of Stargate, DeepSeek, the EU InvestAI initiative and the Canada AI Advantage package. Tensions between nations are high. The Paris AI Summit last week exposed major rifts in global AI governance, with the US and UK refusing to sign the final Summit Declaration. An upcoming summit has the potential to foster deeper understanding of the human brain-AI dynamics, leading to renewed close cooperation among G7 nations. This could also provide the impetus for the EU to stand up for its values to shape the future development of AI.

Politico: Turning Aspirations into Action for Rare Disease Patients

Inspired by the rare disease community's passionate drive to advance policies that provide equitable access to care, UCB spearheaded Aspire4Rare: a global initiative supporting the development of rare disease policies.

Vinciane Quoidbach, research project manager for public health and policy at the European Brain Council and one of the experts involved highlights that "Aspire4Rare addresses broad health care challenges with a focus on early diagnosis, which is crucial for timely interventions, reducing health care pressures, and improving patient outcomes. Rare diseases often go undiagnosed and misdiagnosed due to limited awareness among health care professionals. Aspire4Rare can create educational initiatives to raise clinician awareness of early signs of rare diseases.



The International Brain Research Organization (IBRO) and Wellcome are delighted to announce the extension of the <u>Neuroscience Capacity Accelerator for Mental Health (NCAMH)</u> for a further two editions, with the first due to begin in 2025. The inaugural cycle supported <u>eleven</u> globally significant and innovative projects aiming to enhance mental health-focused neuroscience research in Low- and Middle-Income Countries. By fostering research capacity, and accelerating the potential for impactful research programs in anxiety, depression and psychosis, NCAMH will continue to counter geographical and other systemic barriers which may impact scientific progress.

Results of EFNA's Survey on the Invisible Issues of Neurological Conditions Published

In 2024, the European Federation of Neurological Associations (EFNA) conducted a survey to investigate the invisible issues that affect people with neurological conditions. With 4,687 responses, this survey provides critical insights into the societal, financial, physical and mental challenges associated with having a neurological condition. These challenges extend far beyond health; affecting access to education, employment, and insurance, while perpetuating stigma, discrimination, and isolation. Invisible issues such as sleep disturbances, mental health struggles, and pervasive fatigue further compound the difficulties faced by this population.

By presenting this data, EFNA aims to shed light on the lived experiences of those with neurological conditions, providing the figures and statistics necessary to drive meaningful discussions and action among all stakeholders.
